The Autism Society of America estimates that the lifetime cost of caring for a child with an autism spectrum disorder ranges from \$35 million to \$5 million Based on these estimates, the United States is facing almost \$90 billion annually in costs for autism spectrum disorders These costs include research, insurance costs and non-covered
