5. CLASSROOM BEHAVIOURAL STRATEGIES AND ...

Classroom rules should be limited in number (usually five or less) and stated in positive terms Once the rules have been developed and taught, they should be applied consistently Most students, and especially those who are alcohol-affected, will perform better in classrooms that are structured, predictable, and consistent Teaching Classroom Rules
