In 1872, the world’s first national park, Yellowstone, was born However, while it protected approximately 3,472 square miles of land (2,221,766 acres), it did not protect the gray wolves that lived inside its boundaries In fact, in the early years of the park any visitor to the park could hunt and kill any wild game or predator they
