Evidence on the Developmental and Reproductive Toxicity of ...

- Time to pregnancy and fertility:
 - o A retrospective cohort epidemiologic study found time to pregnancy was not different in women occupationally exposed to xylene
 - o The rat reproductive toxicity study found no effect of xylene exposure on indices of pregnancy or fertility, or on time-to-mating
