together and crescendo into the boisterous first theme. This march-like theme leads to a new playful melody introduced by the oboe. Expect the usual long and steady Rossini crescendo that this time erupts in a bold trombone melody. The remainder of the overture is energetic, even a little rowdy, and ends with a fortissimo valedictory chord.

Gioacchino Rossini (1792-1868) Written: 1817 Style: Romantic Duration: Ten minutes By the time Gioacchino Rossini retired at the grand old age of 37, he had slowed a bit When he was in his twenties, he composed nearly three operas a year, but when he was in his thirties he wrote only one per year Still, 39 is a remarkable achievement
