significantly higher than the control group in the study (Brown, 2010) This is an indication that fine motor programs are beneficial to students in kindergarten This also supports the need for kindergarten students and teachers to have the time, materials, and curriculum in order to develop these fundamental fine motor skills Barriers

Improving Math Performance (PDF)

involves higher order thinking skills Students are taught that a planned procedure is helpful in solving a problem and that process is emphasized in each math topic and unit Students are required to communicate—first orally and later in writing—the process that was used or the reasoning used to arrive at the correct answer
