Neonatal brachial plexus palsy (also known as obstetric brachial plexus palsy) is generally caused by excessive traction on the brachial plexus from the forces of labor, fetal position, and maternal pushing Possible risk factors include large maternal weight gain, maternal diabetes, multiparity, fetal macrosomia/high birth weight,
