1732 - King George II of England grants a charter giving the Trustees permission to establish the Georgia Colony 1733 - James Oglethorpe and approximately 120 settlers arrive in Georgia and begin to construct the city of Savannah 1734 - The first group of Salzburgers arrive in Georgia
