Being a systemic disease, IBD can also be associated with extra-intestinal manifestations Between 6% and 47% of patients with IBD suffer at least from one extra-intestinal manifestation, being dermatological (eg pyoderma gangrenosum, ery-thema nodosum), ocular (eg uveitis, conjunctivitis), rheumatological (eg spondyloarthritis),

Emerging treatment options for extraintestinal ...

Aug 25, 2020 · zumab pegol was an analysis of the Swiss IBD cohort, where response rates were reported as 56%¹⁶ The pegylated anti-TNF agent has been approved for other IMIDs such as rheumatoid arthritis, psoriatic arthritis and ankylosing spondylitis suggesting efficacy in IBD-associated musculoskeletal manifestations
